You need to take special caution when walking in the tall grass or going into the trees to retrieve a plane. Ticks have been reported by a number of members that have had to retrieve planes. The best protection is to pre-spray Permethrin on shoes and clothing. You never spray Permethrin on your skin or clothes while they are on you. Let the clothes completely dry before you put them on. The chemical will remain active for six weeks or six washings. Whatever comes first.

Bob Stiglic has donated a second aluminum ladder. It is down in the cut path at the north east end of the field. That way you do not have to lug the ladder by the shed all the way down to the trees.

Will Lavery announced that we have secured the Old Town Lenexa center on December 5th for the club Swap-N-Shop.

New Business

Steve Spielbusch announced that a former trainee that has since decided that they no longer are interested in flying, has donated a new Apprentice, batteries, and transmitter to the club. Steve said the we will sell it for \$300 to any new interested trainee. If you know anyone interested in flying and looking for a bargain, let them know about the clubs offer

Model of the Month

Two model of the month were presented. Terry Antoszewski presented a SIG Mini-Commander balsa. It weighs 3 pounds, has a 3-blade propeller and uses a 3-cell battery. Terry repaired the plane that he bought at the Swap-N-Shop.

Alex Rillos submitted a build from plans Quaker 60 inch wing span. He 3D printed a dummy diesel engine head, but the plane is electric powered by a Turnigy D3542-1250 KV motor. The ESC is a 40-amp Turnigy Plush. It uses a 2800 mAh 3S battery. It uses a FM radio system with a long working antenna running the length of the fuselage. It uses 3 channels – Rudder, elevator and throttle.

Alex Rillos' entry was the favorite and won the model of the month.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:22 PM.
